Celebrating Breakthroughs,

Looking ahead, we stay committed to our core values of collaboration and quality, believing that diverse perspectives and high expectations drive innovation and create lasting value for the families impacted.

The Urban Institute has been working on the Hello Family Spartanburg project since 2017. Senior Fellow Heather Sandstrom recently expressed excitement about reaching a stage where the project's impact on children and families can be reported. The Institute's evaluation report and inaugural fact sheet, released earlier this year, show that Hello Family's coordinated approach has improved birth outcomes, reduced infant emergency care visits, and led to a decline in child maltreatment cases.


In 2012, the CDC estimated that a single child abuse case results in \$200,000 of lifelong financial costs. Hello Family Spartanburg's services cost \$1.72 million in Year 3 and prevented 58 cases of abuse and neglect, resulting in an average spend of \$29,665 per case of avoided abuse. This is a cost reduction of 85%.

Connecting Parents to Support,

One Call at a Time

Hotline connections remain strong, with most parents seeking resources for finding childcare, affordable housing, and utilities support.

In addition to the hotline, Hello Family Spartanburg continues to meet families where they are, connecting parents with resources at local baby showers and community events.






Building Capacity Through Data:

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BirthMatters


Empowering Birth, Supporting Families.

BirthMatters is a community-based organization focused on improving maternal and infant health. It offers a range of services, including educational programs, doula support, prenatal care, and advocacy, all designed to support families through pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum.

BirthMatters emphasizes holistic care and cultural competence, empowering individuals by providing the resources and guidance necessary to make informed decisions about their health and childbirth experience.

The organization aims to reduce health disparities and promote positive birth outcomes, particularly in underserved communities.



Family Connects

Bringing Support, Care, and Connection to Every Doorstep.

The Family Connects home visiting program provides free, in-home support to parents and their newborn. Registered nurses visit within the first few weeks after birth, providing health assessments, guidance on newborn care, breastfeeding support, and tailored recommendations of local services.

Family Connects aims to promote healthy development, strengthen family well-being, and reduce infant mortality by ensuring that parents receive the support and information they need during the critical early stages of parenting. Currently this program is available to all residents living in the City of Spartanburg, Chesnee, or Cowpens, regardless of income, and will continue to expand countywide through 2030.


Quality Counts

Triple P

Empowering Parents, Strengthening Families.


Triple P (Positive Parenting Program) is an evidence-based initiative designed to support parents in raising healthy, confident children. Triple P aims to strengthen parenting skills, prevent emotional and behavioral issues in children, and enhance family well-being.

The flexible program offers different levels of support based on each family's needs, and can be delivered through group sessions, one-on-one coaching, or online resources.
